POSITION SUMMARY

Under the direction of the Director of Housing and Development, the Project Manager is responsible for all activities related to the development of at least two affordable multifamily housing developments.

Manage two (2) projects through the development process. This will consist of processing land use approvals, garnering community support, preparing funding applications, assembling the development team, supervising the design of the project, closing all construction period financing, monitoring construction, coordinating with Asset Management regarding lease-up and occupancy, closing of permanent financing and transitioning the project to Asset Management. Generally, the Senior Project Manager's projects will be the more complex and challenging projects within the development group's pipeline.
