MODERATE-INCOME FAMILY PROFILE

Dad works as an elementary school teacher, mom works as a bank teller; they have two children.

Estimated annual income: \$94,597



LOW-INCOME FAMILY PROFILE

Dad works as a pharmacy technician, mom works as a child-care provider; they have two children.

Estimated annual income: \$75,670



VERY-LOW-INCOME FAMILY PROFILE

Mom works as a retail clerk and is the only source of financial support in her family; she has one child.

Estimated annual income: \$27,530



EXTREMELY-LOW-INCOME FAMILY PROFILE

A grandparent living alone on Social Security.

Estimated annual income: \$10,884
