



WHAT COULD A HOUSING BOND DO?

1 Help hardworking people live in a safe, decent affordable home. Keep families together and in neighborhoods where they have contributed to the diverse community we enjoy today.

2 Put housing security within reach for Alameda County residents who now pay more than half of their income for housing, including:

- Seniors
- People with disabilities
- Veterans
- Young adults transitioning from foster care into independence
- Low-income families

3 Provide supportive housing for people facing homelessness in Alameda County. Alameda County has more than 5,000 homeless people who need housing and services.

4 Begin to address the shortfall caused by state and federal cuts of 89% in affordable housing investment in Alameda County. County Supervisors are considering an important investment in housing. If placed on the ballot and approved by voters in November, the Alameda County Housing Bond could provide \$500 million in investment in affordable homes for low-income renters, down-payment assistance for first time homebuyers, and an Innovation Fund to seek new solutions to our housing crisis.

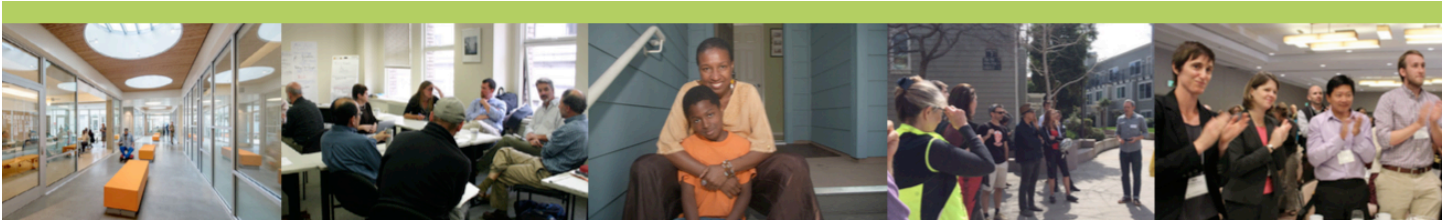
