

STATEWIDE BALLOT

This November, Californians have the opportunity to vote YES on Propositions 1 and 2 to generate \$6 billion for our communities, affordable housing, and homeless programs.

- ▶ **VOTE YES on Prop 1** the *Veterans and Affordable Housing Act*, a \$4 billion general obligation bond that will allow the state to reinvest in California communities by creating supportive housing and assistance for first time homebuyers, including \$3 billion dedicated to affordable housing and \$1 billion dedicated to housing for California veterans.
- ▶ **VOTE YES on Prop 2** the *No Place Like Home Act*, a \$2 billion measure that will help people suffering from mental illness and experiencing homelessness by building stable housing and keeping mental health services in close reach.

LOCAL BALLOT

Depending on where voters live in the Greater Bay Area, they may also have the opportunity to vote on local affordable housing measures.

▶ **VOTE YES on Berkeley Measure O**

a \$135 million general obligation bond, to create more affordable housing options for families, residents, and Berkeley's most vulnerable populations.

▶ **VOTE YES on Berkeley Measure P**

a transfer tax increase of 1% on properties purchased for over \$1.5 million, to raise an estimated \$6 – \$8 million annually for general municipal services, including homeless services, shelters, rental subsidies, supportive services, and staffing.

▶ **VOTE YES on San Francisco City and County Prop C**

a gross receipts tax on businesses with income above \$50 million, to raise an estimated \$300 million annually for affordable housing, wrap around services for the chronic homeless, and legal assistance programs.

- ▶ **VOTE YES on San Jose Measure V** a \$450 million general obligation bond, to create more affordable housing for working families and help those suffering from homelessness get access to a safe and stable home.
- ▶ **VOTE YES on Santa Clara County Measure A** a sales tax renewal, to maintain critical revenue needed for the county general fund, a portion of which can be used for affordable housing developments and programs.
- ▶ **VOTE YES on Santa Cruz County Measure H** a \$140 million general obligation bond, to provide affordable housing for local workers, including teachers, healthcare workers, service workers, and farmworkers, as well as vulnerable populations.
- ▶ **VOTE YES on Santa Rosa Measure N** a \$124 million general obligation bond, to create more affordable housing for local workers, including teachers, healthcare workers, and farmworkers, as well as vulnerable populations, including people experiencing homelessness, veterans, seniors, and people with disabilities, and includes programs to help displaced families rebuild after last year's devastating fires.
- ▶ **VOTE YES on Napa County TOT Measure** a hotel tax, to raise nearly \$5 million annually for affordable housing and homelessness programs. This measure will appear as Measure I in unincorporated areas of the County, as Measure F in Napa, Measure H in American Canyon, Measure D in Calistoga, Measure E in St. Helena, and Measure S in Yountville.
